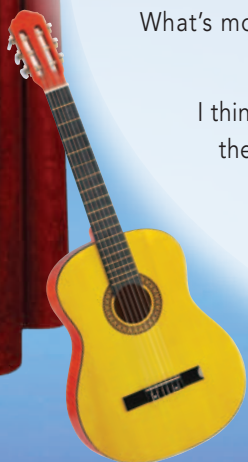

The girl took off her head and showed the wires in her body.

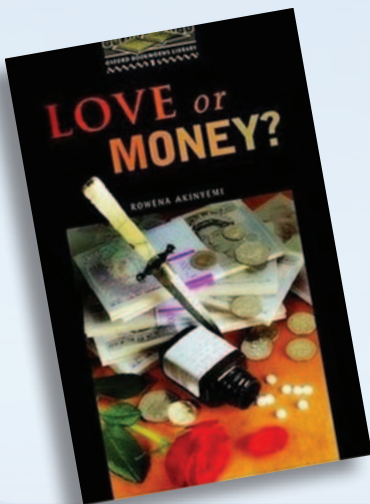
'That's great! You see, I am also a robot!' the girl yelled with laughter.

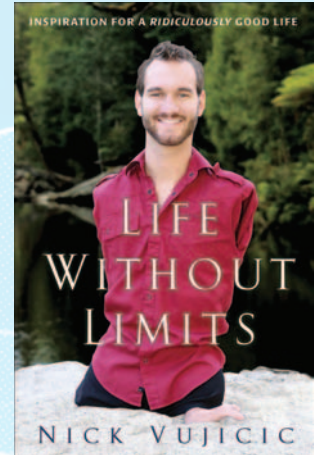
3C Yau Ming Chu

When I saw my friend, I could feel that they were frightened. We talked about the report card.

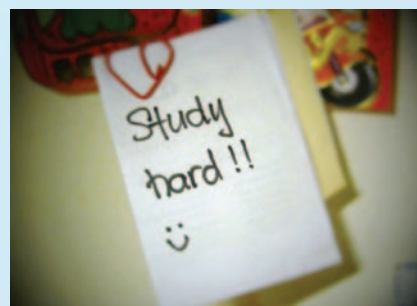
"Don't you know that Chan Siu Man is the top student?" shouted my friend.

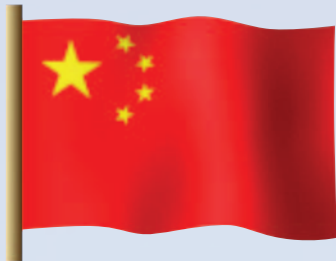

The principal and representatives of parents, teachers and students, therefore have diverging viewpoints on this.

Firstly, if students eat too many snacks during recess, they will lose their appetite easily and don’t want to have lunch at lunchtime. This would lead to other serious problems such as food-wasting since they cannot finish their lunch and hence burdening the landfill problem in Hong Kong. Secondly, students’ health is harmed if they eat too much junk food. Everybody knows that junk food is full of fats, sugars, salts, cholesterol and substances which are detrimental to a person’s health. MMLC or NET

Dear Principal,

I am writing on behalf of my schoolmates concerning the best way of spending the donation of HK\$1,000,000. One week ago, I collected different opinions from schoolmates. In the following, I am going to summarize their views as well as making a recommendation of the best way of spending the donation.

First of all, there are mainly three arguments supporting building one more MMLC. The first one is that more facilities can be available for study. Currently, we have only one MMLC in our school and it is apparently insufficient to deal with the demand. Many students enter the current MMLC and are unable to use a computer because all the computers are occupied. There is no doubt that if one more MMLC is built, more students would benefit from it as they could have a higher chance to get a seat during peak hours.

Moreover, the MMLC encourages students to learn independently. In the MMLC, students use different programs which have been installed in the computer to learn different knowledge. The most commonly used programs are English learning and Music studying. The added MMLC would provide more opportunities for more students to benefit from self-learning.

Compared to employing another NET, it is much more flexible for students to choose when they would like to learn. In fact, after an MMLC is built, students can make use of it whenever they want. However, even if our school employs one more NET, students will have to wait until the NET is available if they wish to speak to the NET.

Building another MMLC has its own advantages but there exists some problems behind it.

The first one is the lack of interaction. Students, who learn by using computers, do not receive any feedback. Sometimes they have even no idea that they are making mistakes. This would not always be a good way to learn.

Besides, without proper supervision, students may not be conscientious during self-learning. Put another way, students may attend the class physically, but not consciously. As a result, efficiency for the learning program would drop.

As for employing one more NET, it brings along advantages as well.

Firstly, it could share the workload of the one and only one existing NET and also the English teachers. English is an essential subject that every student must learn. So, it has long been well-known that English teachers bear the heaviest workload in school. If one more NET is employed, it would alleviate their burden and thus teachers can provide more attention to their students' study process. The teachers will also have ample time to prepare good lessons.

Moreover, it encourages students to learn English. Most of the time, teachers are busy coping with their work and have little time to talk to students in English so as to motivate them. Employing one more NET could therefore offer students more opportunities to speak in English and enhance their English skills.

Yet, on the other hand, it may not be entirely effective to improve students' English ability. The first reason is that even if one more NET is employed, it would still be insufficient to tackle the demand from students to learn English. After all, students from F.1 – F.7 have great demand for NET as they want to practise their spoken English. They need a lot of practice so that they could get a better grade but one more NET may not be enough to help them achieve the goal.

The second reason is that the quality of the new NET is not guaranteed. For example, the new NET may not know the education criterion in HK so well and thus, cannot accurately provide useful comments to students.

Viewing the pros and cons from each opinion, on behalf of the schoolmates, I recommend employing one more NET.

Firstly, with another NET, a better conducive atmosphere for students to speak English is encouraged. It is important for students to learn good English. Also, as our school can show determination to help students in their English proficiency, the reputation of our school can be boosted if one more NET is employed.

Secondly, to learn English effectively, interaction is particularly vital. Students could improve their English ability by getting response from teachers and this is something that another more MMLC cannot do.

All in all, there is a more critical need for students to enhance their English ability. I hope the views and recommendation that I summarized on behalf of the schoolmates are useful for school in determining the use of the donation.
